Targets smashed at Budapest Airport

Budapest Airport continued the seasonal celebrations today as its 16-millionth passenger walked through its doors, marking the highest-ever number of passengers served in the airport's history. Driven by the dynamic expansion of its route network and airline partners, the Hungarian gateway effortlessly reached another passenger traffic milestone, witnessing a solid 9% year-on-year traffic growth.

The outstanding landmark represents six million more passengers than in 2015, an extraordinary 63% increase: "It's guite something to not only witness the growth of an airport but also to be part of the development and progression," enthuses Kam Jandu, CCO, Budapest Airport. "Today's memorable moment speaks volumes for the hard work of everyone at the airport which was unforgettably recognised when we were crowned this year's World Routes Marketing Awards Overall Winner – a first for the airport. But we won't rest, we will always continue to ensure Budapest remains an attractive market for our passengers, as well as our partners, and look forward to another thriving year ahead," added Jandu.

Budapest remains one of the fastest growing airports in Central and Eastern Europe, with 16% more destinations this year the gateway now offers close to 200 routes. Boosting its development further, Budapest has added 33 new links this year and 16 already announced for 2020. While handling one million long-haul seats this year – 100% more than when compared to 2016 - Hungary's capital city airport proudly has 12 non-stop long-haul routes namely: Beijing, Chengdu, Chicago, Chongging, Doha, Dubai, New York, Philadelphia, Sanya, Shanghai and Toronto.

- Budapest Airport is the best airport in the Region, as recognised by Skytrax in six consecutive years from 2014 to 2019, based on passenger ratings. Budapest Airport has become the lead airport in terms of passenger growth and together with its airline partners is a key contributor to the development of tourism in Hungary and Budapest.
- Budapest Airport's terminals are home to 44 airlines which transported 14.9 million passengers to 125 destinations in 45 countries in 2018 (13.5% growth rate in 2018 vs. 2017).
- Budapest Airport in 2018 handled 146.113 tons of cargo (15.9% growth rate vs. 2017).
- Monthly passenger traffic growth November 2019 has exceeded +14.4%.
